

Welcome Back!

September has arrived at Thickwood Heights and we are excited to welcome back our Thunderbirds for another exciting school year. All families are welcome to join us between 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm on Tuesday September 3rd to meet their teachers and enjoy a free BBQ.

Assessment Update

Alberta Education announced over the summer that students between kindergarten and Grade 3 will undergo new proficiency assessment tests. Students in grades 1-3 will have numeracy and literacy assessments in September and January, with additional May testing for students deemed "at risk". Kindergarten students will now be assessed on literacy in January. Grades 4-6 remain the same as last year, with both literacy and numeracy being assessed in September and May. Proficiency assessments help to identify students that require extra support in these areas.

Mobile Devices Update

Starting September 1, 2024, a new ministerial order will restrict the use of personal mobile devices during instructional time. This new order will not have a significant impact on our Thickwood students as it has not changed our current cell phone policy. Our policy states that students are not permitted to use cell phones while in school or on the school grounds. Although students may have a cell phone in their possession, it must be kept in a locker, backpack, etc., and must be turned off. They must not be brought out in the open or they will be confiscated for a period of time, which will increase for repeat offenders. This policy can be found in our handbook along with all important information and dates pertaining to our school.



EXECUTIVE FUNCTION HIGHLIGHT:

Children are continuously learning to keep their personal belongings organized, manage their emotions, stay focused during instruction, manage time effectively and solve problems. Parents and educators need to support them in these areas!

Strategies for executive function development:

- Create morning and evening routines at home
- Teach and model routines to promote independence
- · Talk about executive functioning skills
- · Provide time to organize belongings at school and home
- · Encourage problem solving discussions
- · Create a space for homework completion
- · Limit screen time and encourage physical activity
- · Read daily with your child
- · Make time for brain breaks
- · Support emotional well-being
- · Keep a calendar visible with important dates listed
- Teach your child how to use a planner
- · Open and consistent communication between school and home
- · Involve your child in the planning process
- · Check in with your child
- · Set goals and prioritize tasks
- · Learn to tell time with an analog clock
- · Practice time management
- Discuss coping strategies that work for your child
